

**Dover #1 Kansasville
Notice of Educational Options
For Children Grades 4K-8 Who Reside in the School District**

Dover #1 offers students, grades 4K-8, a variety of educational options for resident students and students choosing to open enroll from a non-resident district.

Some of the specific education programs offered to eligible students who are enrolled in and attending the District include the following:

- Early childhood special education for students who are at least 3 years old but not yet school age
- Special education for students with disabilities
- Gifted and talented education
- Individualized program and curriculum modifications
- Summer school programming

Educational Options

Open Enrollment

The inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside.

Any Wisconsin resident in a four-year-old kindergarten to grade 8 may apply to attend a non-resident school district under the open enrollment program. The regular open enrollment application period for each school year typically starts at the beginning of February of the preceding school year and closes near the end of April.

Additional Educational Options

For students who reside in the Dover #1 School District but who are enrolled in and attending a private school or home-based private educational program include the following:

- Such students have the opportunity to attend summer school classes/programs offered in the district.
- Apply for approval to take up to two courses per semester in our District, pursuant to section 118.145(4) of the state statutes.
- Participate in District Interscholastic athletics and other extracurricular activities as provided under section 118.133.

Special Needs Scholarship Program

The Special Needs Scholarship Program (private school voucher program), was established under state statute 115.7915. Eligible students are those that meet the following requirements:

- Has a current individualized education program (IEP) or services plan.
- Resides in Wisconsin.
- Attended a public school during the previous year.
